- 11. Analyse A Tale of Two Cities as a historical document.
- 12. Romantic poetry, a reaction against enlightenment ideas of the 18<sup>th</sup> century, intentionally reimagines the way poetry should be- elaborate.
- 13. In its expression of alienation and melancholy, "Dover Beach" is a precursor to the 20<sup>th</sup> century crises of faith- examine.
- 14. Critically analyse *Wuthering Heights* "as one of the greatest love stories in the English language."
