- 5. Explore the theme of guilt and its impact on Amir's relationships and sense of self.
- 6. Explain the significance of the title "Journey to the Interior" and its implications for the poem's interpretation.
- 7. Discuss the use of imagery and sensory details in "The Mystic Drum" and their effectiveness in conveying the speaker's experiences.

# Part B: Long Essay. Answer any *four* questions. Each carries 5 weightage.

- 8. How does Senghor explore themes of race and colonialism in the poem "New York"?
- 9. Discuss the role of tradition and culture in "The Road" and its influence on the characters' actions and beliefs.
- 10. Explain the use of irony in A.D. Hope's poem "Australia" and its effect on the reader's perception of the country.
- 11. Discuss the role of women, particularly in relation to power dynamics and traditional gender roles in "Things Fall Apart".
- 12. Explore the theme of identity and its complexities as portrayed in "Hayavadana," particularly in relation to the characters' physical and emotional aspects.
- 13. Discuss the role of family and generational dynamics in shaping Hagar's experiences and relationships.
